Gracia Marín Durán is a Senior Lecturer in International Economic Law at the UCL Faculty of Laws in London. Before joining UCL in 2017, she was a Senior Lecturer in International Economic Law and founding Director of the LLM Programme in International Economic Law at the University of Edinburgh School of Law (2011-2017). Prior to this, she worked at the EU Delegation to the Republic of South Africa (2009-2011) and at the WTO Legal Affairs Division (2007). Gracia's research interests lie generally in EU external relations law and WTO law, and she has published widely on the use and promotion of environmental protection standards in the EU's external economic policies, as well as on the balance between trade liberalisation and environmental protection objectives under WTO law. She has extensive experience in providing legal consultancy and pro bono advice on trade and trade-related matters to international organisations, governmental institutions and non-governmental organisations, including presently as a member of the External Experts Panel advising the Scottish Parliament on the trade-related implications of Brexit.
